The presenter talks about the deep entanglement of race and disability. Both groups have endured limited educational opportunities - opportunity gaps that are built in systems and infrastructure. This is a complex portrayal of multidimensional phenomenon. He speaks to the extent to which African-American, Latino and ELL students are represented in special education to a high degree. Identity intersections and contextual contingencies matter.
